# JOSEPH INTERPRETS PHARAOH'S DREAM

#### **Story Elements**

- TEXT: Gen. 41:1-45
- **Setting**: circa 1730 B.C. in Egypt.
- Main Characters: God, Joseph, the chief butler, and Pharaoh
- Plot: Pharaoh has a terrifying dream, and Joseph is summoned to give the interpretation.
- Key word(s): "what \_\_\_\_\_ is about to do" (v 25, similar in v 28)
- Climax: Genesis 41:25 And Joseph said unto Pharaoh, The dream of Pharaoh is one: God hath shewed Pharaoh what he is about to do.

#### Pharaoh's Dream

- (v 1) Two years after the butler's restoration, Pharaoh also had two terrifying dreams:

   a) (v 2) The first dream consisted of seven cows emerging from the \_\_\_\_\_\_ river. These cows were noticeably healthy and fed in a lush meadow.

## Joseph's Deliverance

- 4) (vv 9-13) As he beheld the events unfolding before him, the chief butler was reminded of Joseph. He lamented, "I do remember my \_\_\_\_\_ this day," and then recommended Joseph to Pharaoh something he had failed to do for two years.
- 5) (v 14) Joseph was fetched out of the dungeon and prepared to stand before Pharaoh.
