Story Elements

- Text: 1 Samuel 25:
- Setting: approx. 1030 B.C.
- Main Characters: God, David, Nabal, and Abigail
- Plot: David is slighted by Nabal and would've killed the man were

- it not for the wise intercession of Nabal's wife Abigail.
- Climax: "And David said unto his men, Gird ye on every man his sword..." (vs. 13)

Samuel's Death (v 1)

- 1. Samuel's death is mentioned in 1 Sam. 25:1. As the last of the ______, his death marks the end of an era for Israel.
- 2. Samuel was so beloved of his people, that multitudes mourned his death at ______.

Nabal's Foolishness (vv 2-13)

- 3. David, still on the run from Saul, journeys with his men into the wilderness of Paran, an area in the northeast of the ______ Peninsula.
 - a. While journeying through Paran and to Carmel, David and his men helped protect the shepherds and flocks of a man named Nabal. (vv 7, 15-16)
 - b. Nabal (whose name means "_____") was a rich man of Maon who was as churlish and evil as he was rich. His wife, on the other hand, was wise and beautiful. (v 3)
- 4. When sheep shearing time arrived, it was the general practice to celebrate with a large
 - a. When David heard of Nabal's sheep-shearing festivities, he sent messengers to appeal to Nabal's hospitality and request provisions for David and his men.
 - b. David's request was not unreasonable, for David and his men had protected Nabal's shepherds and flocks from harm (i.e., the raiding ______ of the region).
- 5. David's reasonable and humble request was met with inhospitable insults. Enraged at Nabal's arrogant ingratitude, David assembled a band of four hundred to plunder and destroy Nabal. (The idiom in v 22 refers to David's intent to kill all the).

Abigail's Wisdom (vv 14-44)

6. Abigail heard of her husband's foolishness and David's wrath, and she prepared a generous gift for David and his men (v 18) and intercepted David before he found

	Nabal. Appealing to David's in God (v 26), Abigail successfully convinces
7	David to restrain his rage. (vv 23-35) The next day, when Nabal began to sober up, Abigail relayed the events to her husband.
,.	Upon hearing of his near-death experience, Nabal's "heart died within him, and he
	became as a stone" (possibly meaning that he suffered a paralyzing). Ten
	days later, Nabal died.
8.	When news of Nabal's death reached David, he thanked God he didn't take matters
	into his own hands and instead allowed God to repay Nabal for his insolence. David
	also asked Abigail to be his wife (she accepted). (v 42)
