# Lesson 125 Jehoshaphat's Secret Weapon

#### **Story Elements**

• Key word(s): "\_\_\_\_\_

• Setting: circa 847 B.C.,

Text: 2 Chron. 20:1-30

- Main Characters: God, Jehoshaphat, and Jahaziel the Levite
- **Plot**: Jehoshaphat prays and God answers by giving Israel a miraculous victory of their enemies.
- Climax: 2 Chronicles 20:14 Then upon Jahaziel the son of Zechariah, the son of Benaiah, the son of Jeiel, the son of Mattaniah, a Levite of the sons of Asaph, came the Spirit of the LORD in the midst of the congregation;

# Prayer for Help

- 1. (vv 1-2) Sometime during Jehoshaphat's reign, a great company of Ammonites and Moabites prepared to invade Judah. Jehoshaphat was notified of the coming invasion by men who had seen the enemy forces assembling near Hazazon-tamar (Engedi).
- 2. (vv 3-4) Jehoshaphat responded to the dire situation appropriately:
  - (a) He \_\_\_\_\_\_ to seek the LORD.
  - (b) He proclaimed a \_\_\_\_\_ throughout all Judah.
  - (c) He gathered a solemn \_\_\_\_\_\_ to seek God's direction.
- 3. (vv 5-13) A national prayer meeting was organized at the temple and King Jehoshaphat prayed and asked God to intervene. The entire nation, including the \_\_\_\_\_\_, participated in the prayer meeting.
- 4. (vv 14-17) During the prayer meeting, the Spirit of the LORD came upon Jahaziel the Levite saying:

### **Praise for Mercy**

- 5. (vv 18-20) Jehoshaphat led his people in giving thanks to God, and the next day the king encouraged his people to trust in God and believe his \_\_\_\_\_\_.
- 6. (vv 21-23) King Jehoshaphat, after counseling with his people, dispatched his troops in the morning and appointed Levite singers to lead the army to battle. As they marched, the choir sang, "*Praise the LORD; for his \_\_\_\_\_\_ endureth for ever;*" as they sung, the LORD caused the Moabites and the Ammonites to attack and kill each other.

- 7. (vv 24-28) When the army of Judah came upon the invaders, they found that they had killed each other off. This miraculous victory produced two other blessings:
  - (a) For three days the Hebrews went through the battlefield and gathered the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of war. On the fourth day they assembled in the valley of Berachah and blessed the LORD.
