Story Elements

- Text: 2 Kings 4:8-17
- Setting: circa 845 B.C., in Shunem
- Main Characters: God, Elisha, Gehazi and a Shunammite couple
- **Plot**: Elisha blesses a Shunammite couple for their generosity to him.
- Key word(s): "what is to be done for _____?" (v 13)
- Climax: 2 Kings 4:16 And he said,
 About this season, according to the time of life, thou shalt embrace a son.
 And she said, Nay, my lord, thou man of God, do not lie unto thine handmaid.

A Generous Couple

- 1. (v 8) In his journeys, Elisha often passed through ______, a city on the eastern side of the valley of Jezreel.
 - (a) Whenever the prophet passed that way he was often invited to dine with a certain _____ couple.
 - (b) (vv 9-10) This Shunammite woman grew in her respect and admiration for the holy prophet, so she asked her husband to build a special roof-top ______ where their frequent dinner guest could stay. The room was equipped with all the things necessary for comfort in that day and age: a bed, a table, a lamp, and a chair.

Returning the Favor

- 2. (vv 11-13) Elisha was so grateful for the couple's generosity that he asked what favor could be returned. The woman replied, "I dwell among mine own people," meaning, "I am ______ with what I have and where I am."
 - (a) (vv 14-17) Elisha turned to his servant Gehazi for suggestions on how best to express his gratitude to the Shunammite couple. Gehazi mentioned their childless state, and so Elisha blessed the couple by prophesying that she would embrace a son within a year, "according to the time of _____." (see. Gen. 18:10, 14)
 - (b) At first, the woman protested because she didn't want her ______ to be dashed, but just as the prophet had promised, the woman gave birth at the appointed time to a son.
